

IIEE Electrocuters Approach-a-bowls 10-0 on DFBC Week 5 Hostilities in DFBC 53rd All Filipino Bowling League 2018, 1st Conference Supported by BeFit – AKI Fitness!!!

Starring Loreto “Tito” Gonzaga with his 664 series highlighted by his 259 in the 3rd game, the electricians pound Approach-a-bowls no end, and earns 10 points versus nil, in the process. After the 2nd round loss, the engineers gathered momentum and are now on a 3 game winning streak and back at the Magic 10 at 6th position. Not even the return of the 2 Approach-a-bowls’ starters from vacation could stop the run-away train named IIEE as Indonesia trained Ganie “Ganpors” Porcinateams up with Tito in the 3rd game to score his own 246 (623 series) and secures 2 bonus points for the team becoming the recipient of the Team of the Week award. Likewise worthy to mention is the contribution of main man Arnel Arias who shocks them with his 612 series and his high game of 245 in the 2nd. Liza “Lawin” Lugtu fresh from her Philippine vacation, takes flight with her 574 and Joven Hinampas (peromahinalang) volts in with his 576. A not so friendly welcome for the 2 balik-Dubai players of Approach-a-bowls AtoLubao who is not so bad with his 595 and Abet Soriano with his 581. Also, main-stay Arnold Asuncion’s 597 is something not to be embarrassed about, same thing with Archie Agustin with his 555 sardines score, but Daisy Rivera’s 529 is quite off the mark. Hear Ye, Hear ye! Team IIEE is for real and a legitimate contender to the title.Hmmmmmm...

Surprise, surprise! Cellar dweller Wild Wild X decimates Covenant 9-0 by playing a beautiful game with a bonus in the 3rd game. After 4 rounds with only 5 points to show, the troop of El Kapitan Sonny Cosio, was getting fed up being the punching bag and so fights back and unfortunately for the Team Covenant, who are themselves not so far above, are this time, at the other end of the stick that they were using just last week. Rodel Calderon plays above par with his 648, transferee Gary Faustino shackles 624, and Kapitan Sonny lassos 612, while Bernie Dela Cruz shows a 576 and Sharon Cosio takes it easy and has 483. Only Maureen Dujali (609) and Marlon Martinez 595 puts up a fight while the rest were there but decides to just gain handicaps. The 2 protagonists have changed positions in the cellar but let me remind you bowling friends that when you’re down, there is no way to go but up.

Now, Numero Uno and its egg ritual intact, much to the delight of DFBC President July Perez, his Harimanok Farms hands over another egg, this time to the unlucky Team Pilipinas quintet dicing them into fine pieces, 8-0 courtesy of Liza Castro’s 621 series, and her 250 high game on the 3rd game. Audrey’s Daddy, Alvin Alfaro fries TP with his own 594, amplified by his 218 in the 2nd game. Andy Erena soft boils 581, transferee Hilda Pilipina sunny sides up 579 and the other half of the Werpa couple Myra Aviles lays 554. On the other side, try as they might, Dennis “John Lloyd” Araza can only counter with his 617, Rey Castillo with his 604 and Toto Agura with his 578, while the others, are much, much more cooperative with the egg distribution. And now, because of their egg generosity, the Farmers are riding high at the top of the field, snatching the lead from erstwhile leader, Ballantines. Is this it? Keep your fingers crossed, Farmers and hope for the best. As the song goes, “Knock- knock-knocking on heaven’s door, yeah, yeah, yeah”.

Xclusive finally finds its bearings and gets back to the win column, trashing B&G 8-2. After gaining 8 points in round 1, they could only muster 8 points in the next 3 rounds. Finallyanother 8 points in round 5, pushes them up back to the Magic 10 at 8th position. Winning the 1st 2 games with 2 bonus points to boot, but gradually losing steam to surrender game 3, still they manage to secure the series and run-away with the 8 points. Helping the cause of the Xclusive are Kapitan Albert Leyesa’s 622, Vice Pres. Edgar Vale’s 624, and Little John Glen Leyesa’s 612, whileBonniManalang who was off-form the past 4 weeks puts up a decent 570. Will Xclusive exclude and brush off the remaining pretenders? We shall see.

Defending Champion Tweeners looks to repeat, or will they? With the luxury of having the Spice Girls in their line-up plus 2 capable Doctors, everything is a possibility and they can come up with so many combinations in their line-up. They tormented expansion team Derdan’s Strikers 8-4, but not without a fight from the rookie team. They easily defeated them in the first game, but an explosive game happens in the 2nd game when both teams connects and earns 2 bonus points apiece. The Champs still takes game 2 but the end game goes to Derdan’s, but the defending Champs, however retains the series lead. Team effort and balance scoring is the key for the Champs but Doc XanthieFronda gives them a much- needed boost in the 2nd game when the opponent arelaunching left and right barrage of strikes. He delivers 621 with a highlight game 2 score of 264. Vacationist Kapitana Kathleen Raymundo joins the fray to sum-up a series of 602, be-moustached Doc Ron

revs up 596, Scary Spice Jaezen Plata dances with 596 and her 257 in game 2 keeps the opposition at bay. Ginger Spice Tess Victoria throws in 543. Team Manager Danny Aquino carries his team with his 627 and GCC mainstay Ramil Tesoro powers 611, Jey Laurel swings away 588 but Kim Co (559) and Kelly Odiong (536) both struggle with their low handicap.

Team Optio (TBS) gets back-up with a clinical win over DCC Cargo 6-2. As is always the case, several times GCC Masters Champion “Idol” UellaMarcial, plays solid scratch games of 226, 203 and 203 to steer her team. Atty. JoeRod shares his 619, the diminutive Bela’s Daddy, VienDatinguino, slow rolls 624, Mommy Elsie Marcial playing her first game this conference pitches in 592 and new recruit Marvin Rebusada was also OK with his 544. The other side did not play so bad themselves, with 2 players scoring above 600, Lukas Sta. Barbara (622) and Baby ArnelBermas (604), but the others did not score enough to thwart the Optioners.

FC bowlers catches the Whiskey Drinkers, Ballantines napping and scores an upset win, 6-2 over the erstwhile league leader. Noel Benavidez’s troop makes good use of their 7 marks handicap advantage and did just enough to stop the rampaging multi-titled team of Kapitan Mario Magdaluyo and play the spoilers role. Noel Benavidez takes the cudgels for his team, scoring 612, while the 2 Chris, Calgao and Toledo delivers 583 and 582 respectively, Reb Esma soft-touches 562 and Ronald Valdez seems content to lower his average with his 539. Fresh from vacation Jay-R Yjares, would not let go, cranking 635 of his own, Ricky Reyes with his below average series of 574, Jun Morales with a sleepy 551, while the rest has a forgettable score. With their win FC bowler is back in the Magic 10, at 10th and Ballantine’s surrenders the pole position and slides down to no. 2.

Sherlock (4 points) and RAK Pocket Snipers (5 points) plays a seemingly friendly game, but the dog-lovers, has all the intent to pole-axe the Snipers, winning the first 2 game on a terribly low-scoring games 1 & 2, only to be frustrated by the timely substitution of Doods Salazar, igniting the Snipers into a barrage of strikes specially punching out in the closing frames, to take game 3 and the series plus a bonus point, not to mention winning thellaveas “hinete”. Lucy Ingente plays solidly and slow balls 608, High Game/WTA “Supremo” Billy Hernandez cross-alleys 572, Doods score plus Eugene Provido’s score of 548 helps their cause, Muscle-man Leo Lerma gives out 543, while Capt. Richie’s 551 was a big help in their last game push. Larry Dolor’s 614, Rica Asuncion’s 582 and “Billionaire” Rodel Billones could not execute the plan, with the last game onslaught of the Snipers. With their earned points in round 5, Sherlock retains 5th position and the Snipers barges back in the Magic 10 at no. 9.

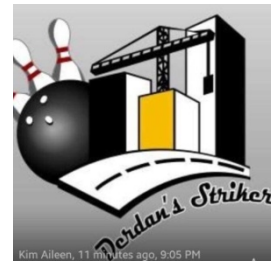
